1000 STUDENTS

In December 2018 Dunboyne College received the ideal Christmas present with confirmation from LMETB, Solas, and the Department of Education that the college will have the teaching resources to reach 1000 students from next year.

This, coupled with the fact that work on identifying a new site for the development of the new campus is well advanced, means that the only college of further education in County Meath can develop

even more new programmes to add to its existing 44 courses, as well as developing new traineeships, apprenticeships and HND qualifications into the future.

The college serves Meath, west Dublin and north Kildare but students are currently coming from other parts of Leinster as well. Last year we had over 2,100 applicants for 800 places so the new allocation for additional students is most welcome.

ART PORTFOLIO


